The project was organised by University of Pitesti, in cooperation with The Language Center srl of Todi (Italy) (main contractor), Instituto Politécnico de Castelo Branco(Portugal), Universitatea din Pitesti, (Romania), Universytet Lodzki (Poland), Giunti O.S. Organizzazioni Speciali (Italy), primary schools from Italy, Portugal, Romania and Poland.

Altogether, 15 people from Italy, Poland, Portugal, and Romania took part in the project.

The overall aim and specific objectives of the project:

The C4C project aims at supporting primary school teachers with a comprehensive training program for CLIL teaching. CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) is a dual-focus educational approach in which an additional language is used for teaching of both content and language. It can be achieved by the foreign language teacher (using cross curricular contents), by the subject teacher (using English as the language of instruction) or by both working in tandem.

Main contents and activities of the project:

A State of the Art Analysis focused on the current experience and the use of CLIL methodology in primary schools and a review of existing web based Open and Educational Resources for CLIL.

A pilot of the Methodology and of the main intellectual outputs: Guidelines on development and use of CLIL in primary schools, CLIL materials and lesson plans for teaching science, mathematics and geography in English, an E-course addressed to teachers on how to use CLIL methodology in primary schools.

Among the results of the project are the following:

During the Mobility C1 held in Pitesti, Romania, researchers shared ideas and best practice examples form their countries about the use of the CLIL methodology in primary schools. They worked together on a Concept Note about the Methodology to be developed by the project.
